



SILVERWOOD SCHOOL 2018-19 TUITION SCHEDULE

TUITION:	\$10,815	Per Student (First- Sixth Grade)
	\$ 9,734	Per Student (Kindergarten)
	\$ 350	New Student Facility/Technology fee

PAYMENT OPTIONS:

1. One payment by check or cash (due by April 5, 2018 for 2% discount).
2. Monthly payments: Monthly prorated amount (plus New Student Facility/Technology fee for new students) due April 5, 2018, and eleven additional payments by check or cash, due by the fifth of each month, May 2018 through March 2019. Alternate monthly payments can be arranged by Head of School approval.

DISCOUNTS:

Paid in Full Discount

A 2% tuition discount is applied to all accounts paid in full by April 5, 2018.

Sibling Discount

Families with more than one student enrolled concurrently shall pay full tuition for one child and each additional child's tuition may be discounted by a dollar amount equivalent to 25% of full annual tuition.

Any kindergarten student who enrolls as a sibling to a current student will receive the greater discount of 25% off the general tuition price. Their tuition will be \$8,112.

Military Discount

An active duty military discount may be applied to all service members' enrolled dependents. The discount shall be a dollar amount equivalent to 10% of full annual tuition per child. This discount may be applied in addition to kindergarten or sibling discounts.

If applicable, financial aid shall be applied after all discounts are applied.

If a student's full annual tuition cost qualifies for more than one discount, only the greater discount may be applied to each student's tuition. The "payment in full" discount is not subject to this limitation and may be applied in conjunction with any discount defined herein.

ADDITIONAL FEES:

\$75 non-refundable payment per student, due with new student application.

\$350 one-time, per-student payment for students new to Silverwood (due with initial tuition payment made)

Silverwood's goal is for most field trips and activities to be covered by tuition. To this end, \$150 per student, per year in attendance at Silverwood, is applied toward the cost of our culminating sixth grade trip. This credit is non-refundable in the event of early withdrawal. Depending on the cost of the trip, the parent contribution will vary from year to year. A few special field trips and school activities which are planned from time to time for grades one through six are billed to families. The Naturebridge trip for grades five and six and the Islandwood trip for grades three and four involve an additional charge to those families. Please call the school if you have any questions about fees.

FINANCIAL AID:

Silverwood School sets aside funds to assist families in meeting tuition obligations. We rely on FAST (Financial Aid for School Tuition) to impartially determine a family's financial needs. Interested families should go to the school website and click on the FAST logo under the financial aid section and follow the instructions. Please note that decisions concerning admissions are not related to application for, or determination of, financial need.

DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS:

If payment is not received when due, Silverwood School may declare the entire unpaid tuition due and demand that amount be paid immediately. A \$25 late fee may be charged for all tuition payments received after the 10th of each month. A persistently delinquent account may result in dismissal of the student and/or legal action. No student will be considered for reenrollment unless all previous charges on his or her account have been paid in full. Report cards/transcripts will be held until all outstanding fees and tuition payments are current.

Silverwood provides an outstanding education, with a low student to teacher ratio, a focused educational program, a beautiful campus, and excellent teachers. R.E.C.E.S.S. Auction


